EDUCATION: Building Successful Youth and Families

Youth can achieve their full potential. All the agencies under this category help our youth succeed academically and graduate from high school with a successful transition to work or higher education. They also help our youth develop the skills and attitudes to be responsible and productive community members.



INCOME & INDEPENDENCE: Increasing Self-Sufficiency

Individuals and families can move from a crisis situation to independently meeting their own needs in healthy and safe environments. Agencies under this category help people connect to a sustainable network of safety net organizations offering a variety of services, referrals, and case management resources to encourage personal and financial stability.



HEALTH: Creating a Healthier Community

People can maintain healthy lifestyles. The agencies that fall under this category target programs and services that provide the education and services that promote a healthy lifestyle and help people manage and prevent chronic physical and mental illnesses.

Some agencies may fall under more than one category because they provide a multitude of services for the community. Or there may be multiple locations for some agencies because there are several different offices. This breakdown is to better help you access your needs and interests for your volunteering experience.

One of the challenges you may face is in understanding where you can volunteer; or what your personal interests are where you can best use your experience and knowledge, and where you'll feel comfortable. That's what this guide will provide. It will help you understand the type of volunteering you want to do, and how you can select by interest areas that you'd like to work with. And then, turning to that page to read about that agency's volunteer needs, and how you can get in touch with the agency to find out how to get started with your volunteer activities.

- Blood Donor Support – You can sign up to work a shift at a one of our blood centers or a blood drive in your local area to welcome, screen and support blood donors.
- Shelter Service Associates and Shelter Supervisors – Become trained to volunteer in person at a shelter when a disaster strikes. We will need volunteers to help support emergency shelters by staffing different areas including reception, registration, feeding, dormitory, information collection and other vital tasks. We have both associate and supervisory level opportunities available. Will you be ready to roll up your sleeves and help?
- Disaster Health Services Associates and Supervisors - We need volunteers who can work in emergency shelters to help assess people's health and provide hands-on care in alignment with their professional licensure.
